SFA FOOTBALL HOSTS NICHOLLS ON SENIOR NIGHT: The Stephen F. Austin Lumberjack football team (6-2/3-1 SLC) will look to put a disappointing 28-7 setback at Texas State behind them as they return home Saturday to host Nicholls. The Colonels enter the game 1-7 (.125) on the season and 0-4 in Southland Conference play. Nicholls has dropped six consecutive games since defeating Duquesne, 14-7. The Colonels are coming off a 38-17 setback against #13 McNeese State. Saturday's game is slated to begin at 6 p.m. from Homer Bryce Stadium.

SFA vs. THE COLONELS: The Lumberjacks lead the all-time series against Nicholls, 18-7 (.720), and have won three of the last four meetings between the two schools. The 'Jacks are 10-3 (.769) all-time against the Colonels in Nacogdoches, and had a 10-game home win streak snapped against Nicholls during the 2007 season. SFA recorded a 50-39 win over Nicholls last season in Thibodaux, La. The following is a look at the last 10 meetings between the two schools:

SENIOR NIGHT: Thirteen seniors will be playing their final home game at Homer Bryce Stadium. The SFA Class of 2009 consists of Cory Barlow, Duane Brooks, Chris Garrison, Karl Glimp, Andre Hicks, Max Holmes, Tim Knicky, Contrevious Parks, Daniel Patricio, Vincent Pervis, Aaron Rhea, Tyrone Ross and Efrain Sanchez.

UNCHARACTERISTIC: The Lumberjacks were shutout in the first half against Texas State, and were held to only seven points for the game. It marked the first time all season that SFA has not managed a point in the opening half, and the first time since facing TCU last season that the 'Jacks have been unable to score double-figure points. It also marked the first time all season that SFA has trailed in a game after three quarters.

CHART TOPPER: Junior quarterback Jeremy Moses became the school's all-time leader in TD passes with his three scoring strikes at Central Arkansas. He now holds the SFA career marks for completions and touchdown passes, and needs less than 1,000 passing yards to become the school's all-time leader in that category.

CONSECUTIVE STRINGS SNAPPED: The Lumberjacks had not only their six-game win streak snapped in San Marcos, but Jeremy Moses had a string of 110 consecutive passes without a pick ended with his interception prior to halftime.

THE COACHES: J.C. Harper became the 18th head coach of the SFA Lumberjack football team in December, 2006. Harper spent two seasons as the defensive coordinator before taking over as head coach. He is 10-21 (.323) during his time at SFA. Nicholls head coach Jay Thomas is 25-34 (.424) in his fifth season in Thibodaux, La.

HEAD COACH J.C. HARPER:

J.C. Harper is in his fifth season with the Lumberjack football program and his third as the 'Jacks' head coach. Harper was named the school's 18th head coach in December 2006.

During his first season as head coach, Harper guided the 'Jacks through a season that saw its roster get decimated by injuries. After an injury-free offseason, the 'Jacks were beset by injuries in the season-opener losing five players that included four starters, three All-SLC selections and an All-American, not to mention the team's top three running backs.

In his second campaign as the head coach, Harper revitalized the program with a new-look offense, along with a new offensive coordinator and a new defensive coordinator. The changes were exactly what the doctor ordered. SFA improved by four games in the win column; the offense recorded several SFA, SLC and NCAA records; and several Lumberjacks garnered national attention for their efforts on the field.

Following the season the individual honors came pouring in for Harper's athletes. Jabara Williams, Tim Knicky and Dominique Edison each earned first-team All-SLC honors, while Edison, Knicky and receiver Contrevious Parks each garnered All-America honors. Receiver Duane Brooks was named SLC Newcomer of the Year, while Moses, offensive linemen Karl Glimp and Cameron Schacht, and punter Drew Nelson each earned honorable mention All-SLC honors.

In his first season on campus, Harper was given the task of guiding a youthful defensive unit through the rigors of one of the nation's toughest schedules. During his second year on the job, Harper began to see some of the fruits of his labor. Harper turned a defense that finished near the bottom in every statistical category in 2005 into the most effective defense in the league. The 'Jacks led the Southland Conference in scoring defense, rush defense and total defense during league games in 2006.

The 2006 season marked the second consecutive year that SFA had produced the league's top tackler. Former Lumberjack Ryan Luedecke made the switch to linebacker as a senior and recorded a career year in 2005. Luedecke led the SLC in tackles on his way to honorable mention All-America honors.

Harper's athletes have been recognized at the regional and national level throughout his time at SFA. Harper has produced seven All-Americans, two all-region selections and 23 All-SLC honorees, including five first-team selections.

A 20-year veteran of collegiate coaching, Harper has spent time serving on the coaching staffs at Western Michigan, Northwestern State, McNeese State, Southwest Missouri State, North Carolina and at Notre Dame.

Harper and his wife, Marcie, are the parents of a son, Michael (4).

LEFTOVERS FROM THE TEXAS STATE GAME ...

- **The Lumberjack defense** held Texas State to only 52 yards rushing. It marks the third time this season that SFA has held an opponent to fewer than 100 yards rushing, and the second time this year the 'Jacks have held an NCAA Division I school (Western Illinois) under 100 yards on the ground.

- **Junior Jeremy Moses** completed 29 passes for 244 yards and one touchdown against the Bobcats. It is only the second time this season that Moses has not throw multiple touchdown passes in a game. Moses has now thrown for 7,802 yards in his career, and needs only 829 more yards to become the school's all-time leader.

- **Senior Vincent Pervis** led the Lumberjacks with 10 carries for a game-high 75 yards. It is the third time this season Pervis has rushed for at least 75 yards in a game.

- **Sophomore Devin Ducote** led the Lumberjacks in tackles for the second consecutive week. Coming off a career-high 16-tackle outing against Sam Houston State, Ducote followed that up with a team-high 13-tackle outing against the Bobcats.

- **Senior Duane Brooks** hauled in seven catches for 55 yards and a touchdown against the Bobcats. Brooks needs only eight more receptions to break the school's single-season record of 68 which he set last season.

BITS and PIECES.....

- **The Lumberjacks** are 9-14 (.391) in televised games dating back to the 1998 season. SFA lost four of its first five televised games during that stretch, and is 4-4 (.500) in its last eight. The 'Jacks are 2-0 in televised games this season.

- **SFA** is 10-15 (.400) all-time when junior Jeremy Moses is the starting quarterback.

- **Since 1993, SFA** holds a 24-26-1 (.480) record in November. The 'Jacks are 23-25-1 (.480) in November regular-season games.

- **The 'Jacks are 8-12** (.400) in their last 20 games at Homer Bryce Stadium. The Lumberjacks went 4-2 at home in 2005, but have gone 4-14 (.222) in the past three seasons prior to 2009. SFA is 4-0 at home this season.

- **SFA** is 62-34-1 (.644) in games at Homer Bryce Stadium since 1993.

- **The 'Jacks** are 64-38 (.627) against unranked Division I FCS teams since 1992.

- **SFA** scored 7 points against Texas State. The 'Jacks have now scored in 96 of their last 97 games.

- **Since 1995**, the Lumberjacks are 18-27 (.386) against teams ranked in the NCAA Division I FCS top 25. After dropping 13 of its last 17 games ranked teams, SFA has now won consecutive games against the top-10. SFA lost all four games against ranked teams in 2007, and went 0-4 last season, but has won both games against ranked programs this year.

- **An overtime win** over Louisiana Tech in 2000 was the first ever win over an NCAA Division I FBS (formerly I-A) team by the Lumberjacks. The 'Jacks are 2-8 (.200) all-time versus FBS opponents. That mark includes a 21-10 loss to Louisiana-Monroe in 1998, and the win over the Indians to open the 2003 season. Despite six SFA turnovers, SMU had to rally in the fourth quarter to defeat SFA, 31-23, in the 'Jacks' lone game against an FBS opponent this season.

- **SFA is 6-2** (.750) all-time in overtime games. The 'Jacks had overtime wins over Central Oklahoma (38-31) and Louisiana Tech (34-31) in 2000, and beat Cal State Northridge (30-27) and Jacksonville State (44-37) in 2001. SFA added its fifth overtime game with a victory over Northern Arizona in 2004. SFA defeated Nicholls, 27-21, to pick up an overtime win in 2005. SFA dropped a 34-31 overtime contest to Sam Houston State last season.

- **Since joining Division I FCS** in 1986, SFA is 23-3 (.880) against non-Division I teams. The 'Jacks lost to Angelo State, 28-24, in 1990 and dropped a 17-14 decision to Delta State last year. SFA opened the 2007 season with a 27-24 overtime loss to Tarleton State.

THE OPPONENT

Nicholls (1-7/0-4 SLC) enters Saturday's contest as one of two Southland Conference schools still searching for its first league win. Nicholls has dropped six-straight games since recording a 14-7 victory over Duquesne in the second week of the season.

The Colonels head to Nacogdoches with one of the nation's top rushing offenses, ranked 21st in the nation averaging 174.5 yards per game. The Colonels have struggled to score points averaging less than 15 points per game, while surrendering more than 43 points to their opponents.

Senior running back Marlin Meeks leads the Colonels' ground attack out of the option offense. Meeks has recorded 83 carries for 404 yards on the season, and is averaging close to 58 yards per game. Classmate A.J. Williams is averaging close to 7.5 yards per carry, and has scored two touchdowns on the year.

Quarterback LaQuintin Caston has completed 44 percent of his passes for 421 yards and three touchdowns, and has also carried the ball 63 times for 77 yards and a team-high three touchdowns.

Nicholls is surrendering just under 467 yards of total offense, and close to 237 yards rushing per contest. The Colonels' defense is led by junior linebacker Yashua Willis. The Napoleonville, La., native has recorded 68 total tackles, and eight tackles for losses. Sophomore defensive back Bobby Felder is second on the squad with 39 total tackles and 3.5 tackles for a loss.

SFA vs. DIVISION I-A

The Lumberjacks have posted a 2-8 (.200) record all-time versus NCAA Division I FBS (formerly I-A) opponents. SFA first played an FBS opponent in 1988 when it traveled to Hattiesburg, Miss., to take on Southern Miss and Brett Favre. The Golden Eagles beat SFA, 21-7.

In 1990, SFA dropped a 31-22 decision to Louisiana Tech in Ruston. SFA then skipped all the way to the 1998 season before facing an FBS opponent again when they took on UL-Monroe, in Monroe. The Indians handed SFA a 21-10 loss. The 'Jacks turned right around the next year and took on Utah State in 1999. The Aggies beat the Lumberjacks 51-17. SFA claimed its first ever win over a FBS opponent in 2000, beating Louisiana Tech 34-31 in overtime.

Ryan Rossner, a freshman at the time, kicked a 35-yard field goal in the second overtime period for the win. The win boosted the 'Jacks to a No. 10 national ranking.

SFA closed out the 2001 season against Texas Tech, dropping a 58-3 decision to the Galleryfurniture.com Bowl-bound Red Raiders. SFA opened the season with a 67-7 setback at TCU to start the 2008 campaign.

The Lumberjacks opened the 2009 season at SMU, and jumped out to a 23-14 fourth-quarter lead, only to see the Mustangs score 17 unanswered in the game's final 14 minutes for the win.

J.C. HARPER QUOTES

On his team's performance against Texas State ...

"Naturally, I was real disappointed with the outcome of the game. My initial thought following the game was that we were flat, but after reviewing the film, I thought our guys played well we just didn't punch it in the end zone. When you get inside the red zone you have to score. We left way too many points on the field, and when you play somebody as talented as Texas State you have to take advantage of those opportunities. I thought that our defense gave a championship effort."

Regarding the upcoming game against Nicholls ...

"Nicholls is a tough team to face every year. Their offense is always a challenge to get ready for because they run it so well. Defensively, we have to be prepared and know our assignments."

Despite six SFA turnovers, the Mustangs had to rally to defeat the Lumberjacks, 31-23, at Gerald J. Ford Stadium in Dallas.

The start of the game was a quarter of big plays for both sides. After a Jeremy Moses interception, senior Cory Barlow returned the favor by picking off an SMU pass and returning it 75 yards to set up the 'Jacks first score of the season.

After consecutive failed drives by each team, SMU tied the game when Emmanuel Sanders returned a Drew Nelson punt 79 yards for the score. Despite the face SFA was intercepted three times in the first quarter, the punt return was the only SMU score in the opening 15 minutes.

SFA battled right back to reclaim a three-point advantage when freshman Evan Engwall drilled a 46-yard field goal, but SMU took a lead into the locker room, 14-10.

SFA scored the first 13 points of the second half, and owned a nine-point lead, 23-14, heading into the fourth quarter. But SMU scored the final 17 points of the game for the victory.

Moses finished the game 31-of-52 for 391 yards and two touchdowns, but also had five interceptions. Rhea was SFA's top target hauling in eight passes for 167 yards and a TD. SFA racked up 460 yards, while holding SMU to 355. Haynes led the SFA defense with seven tackles and an interception. Barlow added six stops, and an pick.

SFA never trailed in the contest against Western Illinois, spoiling the Leathernecks home opener, 40-30. The victory moved SFA to 2-1 on the season, while the Leathernecks fell to 1-2. SFA knocked off seventh-ranked McNeese State, 16-13, to record their first win over a nationally ranked opponent since 2005 (UC Davis). The win gave SFA a 4-1 (.800) overall record, and a 1-0 SLC mark.

A game that was billed as an offensive showcase turned out to be a defensive slugfest. While the Lumberjacks surrendered 427 yards of total offense, McNeese State struggled to find the goal line. SFA forced McNeese State into four fumbles, and picked off a pass. Preseason All-American Jabara Williams and senior Cory Barlow led the Lumberjacks with 15 tackles each, while sophomore Devin Ducote added 13.

SFA jumped out to a 14-point first-half lead scoring a touchdown in the first and second quarters. Sophomore quarterback Jeremy Moses found freshman Gralyn Crawford for a 19-yard reception and sophomore Dalton Williams recorded a one-yard run for the other score.

The Cowboys answered with six points in the third. SFA tacked on their final points of the game after McNeese State was called for a holding penalty in their end zone. The penalty was one of 10 penalties for 120 yards against the Cowboys.

McNeese State cut the lead to three points, 16-13, when Champlain Babin scored his second TD of the night. After forcing an SFA punt, the Cowboys took over at their own one with 4:20 remaining and all three time outs. After moving the ball into SFA territory, Cowboy quarterback Derrick Fourroux fumbled the ball. It was recovered by sophomore Derrick Choice to ice the SFA win.

Moses completed 18-of-34 passes for 226 yards and one TD. His favorite target on the night was senior Duane Brooks who caught nine passes for 140 yards. The 'Jacks carried the ball 28 times for 44 yards.

Freshman kicker Evan Engwall drilled a 35-yard field goal with seven seconds on the clock to boost SFA to a 33-30 win over No. 10 Central Arkansas in Conway, Ark. The Lumberjacks improved to 5-1 overall, and a perfect 2-0 in Southland Conference play.

SFA jumped out to a 14-3 first-half lead behind two touchdown passes from Jeremy Moses to Aaron Rhea. It not only gave SFA a lead, but also made Moses' the school's all-time leader in touchdown passes (66). SFA capitalized on a Central Arkansas special team's mistake. The Bears answered with a touchdown with 2:13 remaining in the opening half.

Central Arkansas opened the second half with a field goal and looked to have the momentum before SFA recovered a fumbled punt. The Lumberjacks converted the mistake into seven points when Moses found freshman Gralyn Crawford in the end zone.

SFA had a 10-point lead, the ball and were driving for what appeared to be the final score, but the Bears blocked a field goal and quickly converted that into a field goal of their own. After recovering the onside kick, UCA's Robbie Park found Preston Echols in the end zone on the very next play to tie the game. But Moses moved SFA down the field in the final 59 seconds to set up a 35-yard gamewinning field goal from freshman Evan Engwall.

The 15th-ranked Lumberjacks rattled off 35 unanswered points to cruise to a 42-3 victory over rival Sam Houston State at Homer Bryce Stadium. The victory ended a five-game skid against the Bearkats, and extended the SFA win streak to six straight, as the `Jacks improved SFA to 6-1 on the season, and 3-0 in conference play. The six victories assured SFA of its first winning season since 2004.

The `Jacks dominated on both sides of the ball racking up 566 yards of total offense, while holding Sam Houston State to 186. The 42-point outburst is the most by an SFA squad since scoring 45 against the Bearkats in 1999. The three points surrendered by the defense are the fewest since the 1991 season.

Neither team was able to crack the scoreboard in the opening 15 minutes, but the Lumberjacks changed that 15 seconds into the second quarter. Junior Jeremy Moses found senior Aaron Rhea from 26 yards out for the first score of the game. The duo hooked up again 1:33 later on a 49-yard pass play, and the Lumberjacks never looked back.

Rhea finished the game with seven catches for a game-high 133 yards and the two scores. Senior Duane Brooks added eight catches for 45 yards and touchdown. Both Rhea and Brooks moved onto the school's all-time top 10 list for receptions.

Moses finished the game completing 27-of-38 passes for 372 yards and five touchdowns. He also became only the second SFA quarterback to pass for 7,500 yards in a career. The defense was led by sophomore Devin Ducote's career-high 16 tackles.

The 11th-ranked Lumberjacks' six-game win streak came to an end with a 28-7 setback at Texas State. The loss dropped SFA to 6-2 on the season and 3-1 in Southland Conference, while the Bobcats are 5-3 and 3-1 in league play.

Although dominating the opening-half stats, the `Jacks went into the locker room down by a touchdown, 7-0. It is only the second time this season that SFA has trailed at the intermission. The Bobcats took the lead on their first drive of the game, and the SFA defense held for the rest of the half. SFA outgained the Bobcats, 243-174, in total offensive yards, and 92-26 in yards rushing, but the `Jacks struggled to crack the goal line. SFA missed two field goals in the opening half, and was stopped on downs from the one-yard line. The `Jacks, who entered the game 28-of-30, from inside the red zone, were 0-of-3 in the opening half, and finished the day 1-of-4.

SFA tied the game midway through the third quarter when junior Jeremy Moses found senior Duane Brooks from 11 yards out for his 73rd touchdown pass of his career, but Bobcats reclaimed the lead at the end of the quarter. Texas State picked off a pass that bounced out of Brooks' hands, and converted the turnover into seven points five plays later. It marked the first time all season that SFA trailed after three quarters. The Bobcats tacked on two more scores late for the final margin.

SFA outgained Texas State, 416-376, on the day including a 151-52 advantage on the ground. Moses completed 29-of-43 passes for 244 yards and one touchdown. Senior Vincent Pervis led the `Jacks ground attack with 10 carries for 75 yards.
