### THE TEXAS STATE-CENTRAL ARKANSAS SERIES

This marks the third time overall that Texas State and Central Arkansas meet on the gridiron, and the Bobcats are looking for their first win against the Bears. Texas State has a 0-2 record against Central Arkansas after dropping a 31-24 decision in San Marcos last season. The Bobcats also suffered a 63-21 loss at Central Arkansas on Oct. 11, 2007.

### LAST TIME OUT

- Bradley George threw for 303 yards and four touchdowns to lead Texas State to a 28-7 victory over No. 11 Stephen F. Austin in its annual homecoming game at Bobcat Stadium. George tied his own school record with 31 completions as he completed 30 of his 41 passes.
- In addition, the Bobcat defense held the nation's top scoring offense to a season-low seven points as the Bobcats forced three turnovers and held the Lumberjacks to out of the end zone three of their four times in the red zone.
- Texas State took an early 7-0 lead with 8:43 left to play in the first quarter when George hit Mishak Rivas in the back of the end zone from nine yards away. It was the first touchdown reception of the season for Rivas and it capped a nine-play, 67-yard drive.
- That was how the score ended in the first half as Texas State held the Lumberjacks scoreless in their three trips inside the Red Zone. The Lumberjacks entered the game having converted 28-of-its 30 red-zone scoring opportunities this season.
- The first stop came in the first quarter when Stephen F. Austin's Evan Engwall missed a 22-yard field goal wide to the right.
- In the second quarter, Texas State's Travis Houston pressured SFA's Jeremy Moses to throw his pass on a fourth-down play from the one-yard line.
- The third stop inside the red zone, Texas State's Joe Bell forced a fumble by Romont Hampton and Marcus Clark recovered it at the Bobcat 11-yard line.
- Stephen F. Austin tied the score at 7-7 with 7:58 left to play in the third quarter when Jeremy Moses hit Duane Brooks in the right corner of the end zone from 11 yards away to cap an eight-play, 65-yard drive.
- Texas State pinned the Lumberjacks at their own six yard line after their drive stalled at their own
- The Bobcats took advantage when George hit Alvaro Garcia for an eight-yard touchdown pass to cap a five-play, 35-yard drive.
- Texas State increased its lead to 21-7 with 3:58 left in the fourth quarter when George hit Rivas for a second touchdown, this one from 32 yards out.
- The Bobcats closed out the scoring with 1:08 left when George hit Da'Marcus Griggs for a 17-yard pass to make the final score 28-7.

### TEXAS STATE POSTGAME

There is no player availability on the field immediately after the game. Texas State has a closed locker room policy after games. At home games, individual players and coaches will be made available to media members for postgame interviews inside the theatre meeting room of the End Zone Complex only through request and approval of the sports information and coaching staffs.

On the road, the locker room situation will dictate postgame protocol, please consult the Texas State SID Rick Poulter. Head coach Brad Wright will address the assembled media only after his postgame radio show responsibilities have been completed both at home and on the road. Coach Wright will address the media in the theatre room prior to any player comments.

### WEEKLY PRACTICES

All practices will be open to the media during the season. Texas State players and coaches will be available post-practice to the media on Monday-Thursday only. Players and coaches will not be available to the media postpractice on Fridays. Media members are requested to schedule post-practice interviews with individual players through the Texas State sports information staff.

### PHONE REQUESTS

Phone interviews Monday through Wednesday with requested players will be taken by the sports information staff and every effort will be made to fulfill them. However, due to class schedules and team commitments, not all interview requests can be honored. Student-athletes are not available for phone interviews on Sunday, Monday or Friday. No student-athlete phone numbers will be provided to media members.

### STORY LINES FOR THE BOBCATS

Texas State enters the Central Arkansas game looking to win its fourth straight Southland Conference game after winning a pair of back-to-back SLC road games at Nicholls and Northwestern State and defeating 11th-ranked Stephen F. Austin in Bobcat Stadium last Saturday... The Bobcats enter Saturday's game with a 5-3 overall record and are in a four-way tie for first place in the SLC standings with a 3-1 mark... Last Saturday's win over Stephen F. Austin marked the second straight season that Texas State played its annual Homecoming game against a nationally-ranked team and the first-place team in the Southland Conference standings... Last season, Texas State dropped a 31-24 decision against Central Arkansas... This Saturday's game at Central Arkansas will be the second of three straight Southland Conference games in which the Bobcats will play a nationally-ranked team... In addition to SFA being ranked 11th last Saturday, Central Arkansas enters this Saturday's game ranked 19th in the latest FCS Coaches Poll and 20th in the Sports Network's FCS poll... The Bobcats return home to play host to McNeese State next Saturday, and the Cowboys are ranked No. 11 by the FCS Coaches and No. 12 by the Sports Network this week... The Bobcats enter Saturday's game looking to win their fourth straight game for the first time since winning five straight in 2005... The three straight wins this season equal the longest winning streaks the Bobcats had each of the last two seasons... Texas State also looks to improve to 4-1 in Southland Conference play for the first time since 2005 and third time overall since joining the league in 1987... The win at Nicholls came after Texas State lost back-to-back games for the first time since the Bobcats lost their last two games of the 2007 season at Nicholls and against Sam Houston State... Texas State remains the only team to score 21 points against FBS member TCU's defense and the first team to net 21 points against the Horned Frogs in Fort Worth for the first time since Utah won a 27-20 decision on Oct. 18, 2007... Brad Wright is in his third season as head coach at his alma mater, Texas State, and enters Saturday's game against Central Arkansas with a 17-15 career record... Bradley George recorded his fourth 300-yard passing games this season with 303 yards passing against SFA... He also threw for a season-best four touchdowns against the Lumberjacks... The two straight wins in Louisiana marks the second time in school history and the first time since 1995 that Texas State has won back-to-back games in Louisiana... It is the second straight season that Texas State has posted a 2-0 record in road games played in Louisiana and third time overall... Last season, the Bobcats won SLC road games at McNeese State and Southeastern Louisiana... The only other time was in 1995 when Texas State won back-to-back games at Nicholls and Northwestern State for the first time... Texas State was chosen by Southland Conference coaches and sports information directors to win the 2009 SLC championship... The Bobcats have won two SLC titles since joining the league and becoming a NCAA Division I member in 1987... Texas State returns seven starters to its offensive unit that produced a 1,000-yard rusher, 1,000-yard receiver and a 2,000-yard passer for the second straight season in 2008... The Bobcats began the season with eight returning starters from the 2008 campaign, but junior running back Karrington Bush suffered an knee injury against Nicholls and will miss the rest of the season.

### GEORGE AND BELL NAMED SLC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Following last Saturday's 28-7 upset win over No. 11th-ranked Stephen F. Austin, Texas State senior quarterback and Bradley George and senior linebacker Joe Bell have been selected as the Southland Conference Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively/ George was selected as the Offensive Player of the Week after tying his own school record of 30 completions and throwing for four touchdown passes. He completed 30 of his 41 passes against the Lumberjacks for 303 yards and a season-best four touchdowns. His 30 completions tied his own school record and marked the fourth time in his career and second time this season that he has accomplished the feat.

Bell recorded 10 total tackles against Stephen F. Austin after he totaled 15 total tackles with five solo stops and 10 assisted tackles. He

also forced a fumble on Texas State's 19-yard line and the Bobcats recovered the ball for the first of three turnovers that Texas State forced. The Bobcats also held Stephen F. Austin to just one of four scoring attempts inside the red zone. In addition, the senior from Cypress Falls High School in Houston had 1.5 tackles for losses of five yards against Stephen F. Austin.

Texas State punter Ben Follis earned Honorable Mention SLC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. Central Arkansas kicker Eddie Carmona was named the conference's special teams player of the week after kicking four field goals at Southeastern Louisiana.

Each Southland Conference school's sports information director nominates and votes for the players of the week, though is not permitted to vote for his own player. To receive honorable mention, a player must receive votes from 25 percent of the Southland sports information directors.

### 102 YEARS OF BOBCAT FOOTBALL

Texas State is in its 102nd season of playing intercollegiate football and enters the Central game with an all-time record of 478-395-26. The Bobcats began playing football in 1904, when they opened with a 5-1 record. Texas State did not play football in 1942, 1945 and 1946. The Bobcats have won 11 Conference championships during their history, including last season when Texas State won their first outright Conference title and 2005 season when Texas State was co-champion of the Southland Conference.

### BACK TO BACK WINNING SEASONS

Texas State enters Saturday's game with a 5-3 overall record and the Bobcats need one more win to secure their first back-to-back winning seasons since 1990 and 1991 when the Bobcats finished those seasons with 6-5 and 7-4 records, respectively. Last season, Texas State finished with an 8-5 mark and advanced to the NCAA Division I FCS Playoffs for the second time in four years. Since the 1991 season, Texas State had two other winning seasons with a 7-4 mark in 2000 and an 11-3 record in 2005.

### BOBCATS ON THE ROAD

Texas State enters the Central Arkansas game with a 2-2 record in road games this season. The Bobcats have won their last two road contests with a 20-17 triumph at Northwestern State on Oct. 24 and a 34-28 victory at Nicholls on Oct. 17. Texas State opened the season with a 56-21 loss at then #15 FBS-ranked TCU on Sept. 19 and a 38-16 setback at Southern Utah on Oct. 3.

The Bobcats have won their last six Southland Conference road games dating back to last season when Texas State won all four road contests. That is the second longest road winning streak in SLC road games by current SLC members. McNeese State won nine straight SLC road games in 2006-08. Northwestern State and Stephen F. Austin won five straight SLC road contests.

Texas State's win at Nicholls marked the first time the Bobcats had won a game in Thibodaux since 1999. Texas State had lost four straight games at Nicholls before last Saturday's win.

Last season, Texas State won SLC road games at McNeese State, Stephen F. Austin, Southeastern Louisiana and Sam Houston State.

### TEXAS STATE AT BOBCAT STADIUM

Texas State equaled its 2008 win total in home games when the Bobcats upset 11th-ranked Stephen F. Austin to improve their home record to 3-1 in home games this season. In addition to the win over Stephen F. Austin, Texas State won their first two home games against Angelo State and Texas Southern before opening its Southland Conference schedule with a 51-50 loss against Southeastern Louisiana on Oct. 10.

The win over SFA also gives the Bobcats an all-time record of 99-69 in games played at Bobcat Stadium. Texas State began playing on their home field in 1981 and had a 6-1 mark at home that season. This season's 3-1 record in home games came after Texas State posted

a 3-3 mark in home games during each of the past three years, The Bobcats won a school record nine home games in 2005 when they finished with a 9-1 record in home contests. In 2002, the stadium was renamed Jim Wacker Field at Bobcat Stadium in honor of the school's highly successful head coach and former athletics director. In his first seasons as head coach, Wacker had a 42-8 record and led Texas State to the 1981 and 1982 NCAA Division II national championships.

#### 4-1 SLC RECORD

Texas State looks to begin Southland Conference play with a 4-1 record for the first time since 2005 and the second time overall since joining the league in 1987. Texas State finished the 2005 campaign with a 5-1 league record. The 3-1 record this season marks the fifth time in school history the Bobcats have opened SLC play with a 3-1 mark. The other three times were in 1990, 1991 and 2004.

#### BACK-TO-BACK SLC CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Bobcats are looking to win their second straight Southland Conference championship for the first time in school history. The Bobcats have won two SLC titles since joining the league and becoming a NCAA Division I member in 1987. Texas State also won a SLC co-championship in 2005. The Bobcats had one second place finish in 2000 and four third place showings in 1989, 1990, 1995 and 2004.

#### EIGHT WINS

Texas State is looking to win at least eight games in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1981-83 when the Bobcats won a combined 36 games in three seasons. Last season, the Bobcats won eight games as a NCAA Division I FCS school for just the second time since 1987. In addition to posting an 8-5 record in 2008, Texas State also had an 11-3 mark in 2005.

#### NATION'S 10TH-RANKED PASSING OFFENSE

Saturday's game between Texas State and Stephen F. Austin will match two of the nation's Top 10 FCS passing offenses. The Bobcats enter game ranked 10th among the with an average of 277.43 yards per game this season after throwing for 291 yards at Northwestern State, 233 yards at Nicholls and a season-best 337 yards against Southeastern Louisiana in the last three weeks. Texas State's 337 yards passing against Southeastern Louisiana marked the third time the Bobcats have topped 300 yards passing. Texas State also recorded 325 yards passing against Texas Southern on Sept. 26 and 328 yards against Angelo State.

The Bobcats also enter the game ranked third among Southland Conference schools behind Stephen F. Austin and Southeastern Louisiana. The Lumberjacks lead the nation with an average of 360.3 yards per game, while Southeastern Louisiana averages 286.9 yards per game.

#### NATION'S 12TH-BEST SCORING OFFENSE

The Bobcats enter this weekend with the nation's 12th-best scoring offense with an average of 33.63 points per game after scoring 132 points in the first four Southland Conference games this season. Texas State has topped 40 points three times this season after it tallied a season-best 52 points versus Texas Southern, 50 points against Southeastern Louisiana and 48 points against Angelo State.

Texas State enters the Central Arkansas game having topped 30 points in 11 of its last 20 games. In addition to scoring over 30 points three times in 2009, Texas State scored a season-high 63 points against Texas Southern, 62 points at Stephen F. Austin, 48 points at Sam Houston State, 45 points at McNeese State, 38 points at Southeastern Louisiana, 34 points against Nicholls and 31 points versus Northwestern State in 2008.

#### BALANCED OFFENSE

In each of the last three seasons, Texas State featured a bal-

anced offensive attack. This season, Texas State ranks third in passing offense and fifth in rushing offense among Southland Conference teams with an average of with 283.2 yards passing and 153.8 yards rushing per game. The Bobcats have thrown for 17 touchdowns and lead Southland Conference teams with 18 rushing touchdowns.

In 2008, the Bobcats had the third-best rushing offense and third-best passing offense among Southland Conference teams. Texas State gained 184.08 yards per game on the ground and threw for an average of 269.15 yards per game. The Bobcats threw for 34 touchdowns and ran for 26 TD's.

Bradley George threw for 2,660 yards and 26 touchdowns, and Cameron Luke caught 73 passes for 1,268 yards and 17 touchdowns. Karrington Bush ran for 1,065 yards. It was the second straight year that Bush ran for 1,000 yards, George threw for 2,000 yards and Luke had over 1,000 receiving yards. This season, George has thrown for 2,234 yards and 16 TDs in the first eight games, while Da'Marcus Griggs has caught 61 passes for 692 yards and six touchdowns. With Bush sitting out three games this season, the Bobcats have three running backs combine for 939 yards rushing.

#### TEAM CAPTAINS IN 2009

The Texas State football team elected Bradley George, Alex Luna, Travis Houston and Marcus Clark as team captain for 2009. This marks the third straight season that George has been selected a team captain by his teammates. Luna started every game in 2007 and 2008 on Texas State's offensive line after moving over from defensive tackle. Houston started every game last season at defensive end and Clark ranked second among team leaders in tackle last season after leading the Bobcats in tackles as a freshman in 2007.

#### FIVE BOBCATS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SLC

Seven Texas State players were named preseason All-Southland Conference selections in a poll of SLC coaches. They include All-SLC First-Team running back and return specialist Karrington Bush and offensive lineman D.J. Hall. The All-SLC Second-Team choices were quarterback Bradley George, offensive lineman Calvin Gore and Alex Luna, along with linebacker Marcus Clark.

Last season, Bush rushed for over 1,000 yards for the second straight season with 1,065 yards and 11 touchdowns. He also set a school record when he returned 42 kickoffs for 1,055 yards and one TD.

Hall, Gore and Luna were part of an offensive line that ranked 19th nationally in fewest sacks allowed and paved the way for one of the nation's top eight offenses.

George ranked among the nation's top six most efficient passers and became the first Texas State quarterback to throw for over 2,000 yards in two consecutive seasons in 2008. He completed 181 of his 301 passes for 2,660 yards and 26 touchdowns last season.

Clark also was named an All-SLC Second-Team selection after recording 85 tackles, one interception and one recovered fumble in 2008. Clark ranked second among team leaders in tackles last season after leading the Bobcats in tackles as a freshman.

#### CAREER LEADING PASSER

Senior quarterback Bradley George enters the Central Arkansas game as Texas State's all-time career leader in passing yards with 8,648 yards after eclipsing the 2,000 yards passing mark for the third straight season.

He threw for 303 yards against Stephen F. Austin and a season-best 337 yards against Southeastern Louisiana to give him four 300-yard passing days of the season. He also threw for 325 yards against Texas Southern and 328 yards against Angelo State.

He also ranks second career leaders among Southland Conference quarterbacks in career passing yards behind Nathan Brown of Central Arkansas who ended his career with 10,558 yards from 2005-08.

#### GEORGE AMONG SLC PASSING LEADERS

Texas State senior quarterback Bradley George enters the Central Arkansas game ranked second among 2009 Southland Conference leaders with 2,213 yards passing after throwing for 303 yards against Stephen F. Austin and 291 yards at Northwestern State. George averages 279.2 yards passing per game this season and has completed 186 of his 292 attempts.

He is the first Texas State quarterback to throw over 2,000 yards in three consecutive seasons. Last season, he became the first Texas State quarterback to throw for over 2,000 yards in two consecutive seasons and is on pace to accomplish the feat during a third straight season.

#### GEORGE BECOMING MORE ACCURATE

Bradley George enters the Central Arkansas game having thrown just one interception in 152 pass attempts in Southland Conference play after throwing seven interceptions in 143 attempts in the first four games of the season. He enters the UCA game having thrown 131 straight passes without an interception.

#### GRIGGS PICKS UP PACE

Texas State junior wide receiver Da'Marcus Griggs enters the Stephen F. Austin game tied for sixth nationally and leading Southland Conference receivers with 7.62 receptions per game after catching a nine passes for 91 yards and a touchdown against Stephen F. Austin. Griggs caught a career-best 11 passes for 129 yards at Northwestern State. Earlier this season, Griggs caught 10 passes for a career-best 142 yards against Texas Southern and nine passes for 102 yards against Southeastern Louisiana.

#### DILLARD IN THE TD COLUMN

Daren Dillard caught his fourth touchdown pass of the season at Nicholls with a six-yard touchdown reception. Dillard also had a 10-yard touchdown reception against Southeastern Louisiana. His other two TD catches were a 16-yard touchdown passes at TCU and an 11-yard TD reception against Texas Southern. Dillard also returned an on-sides kick by Angelo State 38 yards for a TD as well.

He enters the Central Arkansas game 27 receptions for 339 yards and four touchdowns this season. Last season, Dillard caught 25 passes for 433 yards and five TDs.

#### OUT OF THE BACKFIELD

Senior running back Alvin Canady is one of Texas State's leaders in receptions for the second time in the last three years after catching 21 passes for 215 yards and one touchdown in the first eight games this season. In 2007, Canady ranked second among Texas State leaders with 37 catches for 264 yards and three touchdowns.

Canady also has rushed for 356 yards and five touchdowns on 76 carries this season.

#### IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Sophomore Alvaro Garcia enters the Central Arkansas game having caught 16 passes for 243 yards in his first full season as a wide

receiver. A record-setting quarterback in high school, Garcia moved to the receiver position midway through the 2008 season and caught two passes for 27 yards in 2008. Garcia caught a season-best four passes against Stephen F. Austin and had three catches at TCU and Southern Utah. He also caught the longest pass by a Bobcat this season with a 71-yard reception against Angelo State.

#### **BOLDEN ON THE EDGE**

Sophomore wide receiver Darius Bolden has caught 12 passes for 168 yards this season after catching just six passes for 74 yards in 12 games in 2008. Bolden caught a season best three passes in two games against Texas Southern and Southeastern Louisiana. He also had two receptions for 24 yards against Stephen F. Austin, two catches for 21 yards at Nicholls after gaining a season-best 81 yards against Texas Southern and 29 yards versus Southeastern Louisiana. Bolden opened the year with one reception for nine yards versus Angelo State and had one catch for four yards at TCU.

#### **ALEXANDER LANDING**

Sophomore wide receiver Cedric Alexander enters the Central Arkansas game having caught nine passes for 152 yards and a touchdown this season. Alexander's touchdown reception came against Angelo State when he caught a 48-yard TD pass. He finished that game with five receptions for 83 yards. Alexander caught a 31-yard pass against Stephen F. Austin.

He also scored another touchdown on a 10-yard run and recorded 191 all-purpose yards against Angelo State after transferring from Hardin Simmons. Alexander has eight carries overall this season for 52 yards.

#### **TOUCHDOWN REDDIC**

Frank Reddic enters the Central Arkansas game having run for 198 yards and five touchdowns on 49 carries this season. Reddic scored a touchdown in each of Texas State's first four games this season and was the only Bobcat to accomplish the feat. He ran for one-yard TD in the fourth quarter at Southern Utah after scoring two touchdowns against Texas Southern with a 19-yard run and a four-yard run in the fourth quarter as well. He also scored Texas State's first touchdown at TCU with a one-yard run and began his collegiate career with a six-yard TD run against Angelo State. He also gained 42 yards on seven carries at Nicholls.

#### **FIVE RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS**

Texas State rushed for five touchdowns in two games this season. The Bobcats ran for five touchdowns against Southeastern Louisiana after running for five TD rushes against Texas Southern with Frank Reddic and Alvin Canady running for two TDs each. In addition, Trey Hampton scored his second one-yard touchdown of the season. Hampton scored his first touchdown as a Bobcat against Angelo State earlier this season.

Karrington Bush led the Bobcats with a career-high three touchdown runs against Southeastern Louisiana. In addition, Alvin Canady ran for one and reserve quarterback Tim Hawkins ran for another against the Lions.

#### **A PAIR OF TWO TD RUNS**

Frank Reddic and Alvin Canady each rushed for two touchdowns against the Tigers. That is the first time that has occurred since Sept. 2, 2006, when Chase Wasson and Daniel Jolly each ran for TD's against Tarleton State.

#### **MCCLENDON IN THE END ZONE**

Junior tight end Woody McClendon scored the first touchdown of his career when he caught a 10-yard TD pass from Bradley George at Nicholls. McClendon has caught two passes for 15 yards this season. He also caught a five-yard pass against Southeastern Louisiana.

#### **ANDERSON ALSO SCORES**

Senior tight end Kyle Anderson scored his first touchdown at Texas State when he caught a one-yard TD pass from Bradley George against Angelo State. Anderson entered the 2009 season with one reception for four yards at Montana after moving over from left guard in 2008.

#### **BUSH OUT FOR THE SEASON**

After playing in his third straight game at Nicholls, Karrington Bush re injured his right knee in the fourth quarter and will be lost for the rest of the season after rushing for a season-best 163 yards on 20 carries. Bush returned to Texas State starting lineup against Southeastern Louisiana and registered his first 100-yard rushing game of the season when he gained 129 yards and scored a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries.

He ends the 2009 season with 385 yards and four touchdowns on 59 carries this season. Last season, he became the first Texas State player since 1997 and second Texas State player ever to rush for over 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons. Bush ran for 1,065 yards and 11 touchdowns on 136 carries in 2008. He was named the SLC Freshman of the Year and an All-SLC Second-Team selection in 2007 after rushing for 1,039 yards and three touchdowns on 137 carries.

His 7.8 yards per carry in 2008 ranks as the second-highest rushing average in school history and his 7.6 yards per carry in 2007 is the third highest average. His 1,065 yards last season is the seventh-highest single season total in school history and his 1,039 yards in 2007 is the ninth-highest total.

#### **FIVE RETURNING STARTERS ON DEFENSE**

Texas State also returns senior end Travis Houston, linebackers Marcus Clark and Joe Bell, cornerback Will Thompson and strong safety Kenneth Hampton as starters on defense from 2008.

#### **OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSE**

Texas State ranks second among Southland Conference teams after forcing 18 turnovers in the first eight games of the 2009. The Bobcats forced a season-high five turnovers against Texas Southern and also caused four turnovers at Nicholls. The Bobcats also forced three turnovers against Stephen F. Austin after having forced two turnovers each against TCU and Angelo State. The Bobcat defense has forced 31 turnovers in their last 14 games, dating back to the last six games of the 2008 campaign. Last season, Texas State collected 24 turnovers overall.

#### **TEXAS STATE SACK PARTY**

Texas State also is tied for fifth among Southland Conference teams after collecting their 11th sack against Stephen F. Austin. The Bobcats recorded three sacks against Northwestern State, and that is the most sacks against a Southland Conference opponent this season. Texas State has collected all 11 sacks in the last six games after not having a quarterback sack in the first two contests. The Bobcats had one sack versus Stephen F. Austin, Nicholls, Southeastern Louisiana and Southern Utah after collecting the first four sacks of the season against Texas Southern. The sacks totaled 74 yards in losses. Last season, Texas State recorded 23 sacks while giving up just 15.

Ron Jackson recorded a sack in three of the last four games against Northwestern State, Nicholls and Southeastern Louisiana. Jackson had a sack for a loss of a yard after recording a sack for a loss of five yards at Nicholls and one sack for a loss of six yards against Southeastern Louisiana.

Joplo Bartu had a sack for a loss of eight yards against Stephen F. Austin.

The most memorable sack at Northwestern State was by nose tackle Garrett Hood, who recorded the first sack of his career on the

last drive of the game by the Demons. In addition, Adley Eshraghipour and Travis Houston combined for a sack that resulted in a four-yard loss against the Demons.

Ralston Dews had one sack for a loss of one yard against Southern Utah. In the Texas Southern game, Marcus Clark had one sack for a loss of 16 yards, Matt Harris had a nine-yard sack, Patrick Strodtman registered a sack for a loss of seven yards and David Torres had a sack for -6 yards.

#### **TOUGH IN THE RED ZONE**

Texas State ranks second among Southland Conference teams in red zone defense after allowing teams to score 76.3 percent of the time. The Bobcats have given up 26 touchdowns and three field goals in 38 tries inside the Red Zone this season. Last season, Texas State ranked 17th nationally in Red Zone Defensive Efficiency after holding opponents to a scoring percentage of 71 percent. Bobcat opponents scored 34 touchdowns (17 rushing and 17 passing) and converted 8-of-22 field goal attempts after advancing the ball to the red zone.

#### **CLARK LEADS DEFENSE**

Junior linebacker Marcus Clark led Texas State with a career-high 16 tackles against Stephen F. Austin when he recorded two solo stops and assisted on 14 others. It marks the third time in the last four games that he has led the Bobcats in tackles.

Clark ranks second among SLC leaders with an average of 8.9 tackles per game. He recorded 13 tackles at Northwestern State and 10 tackles against Southeastern Louisiana to lead the Bobcats in both games.

Clark also had a season-best seven solo tackles at Northwestern State after recording five solo stops in each of the previous two games versus Nicholls and Southeastern Louisiana.

In addition, he tied for the team lead with seven tackles against Texas Southern after leading the Bobcats with eight tackles at TCU and collecting five tackles against Angelo State.

Last season, Clark was second among team leaders with 85 tackles last season after leading the Bobcats with 71 stops as a true freshman in 2007.

#### **BELL AMONG THE TOP 10**

Senior linebacker Joe Bell recorded 15 tackles and tied for the team lead with five unassisted tackles against Stephen F. Austin. Bell ranks among the top 10 leaders in the Southland Conference with an average of 6.8 tackles per game after collecting 41 total stops in six games this season.

Earlier this season, Bell registered seven tackles against Nicholls and Southern Utah.

He also forced a fumble against the Lumberjacks and ranks second among Southland Conference leaders in that category this season with an average of 0.33 after forcing two fumbles in six games this season.

#### **IWUJI IN THE TACKLES COLUMN**

Sophomore linebacker Bryan Iwuji (E-woo-gee) ranks 14th among Southland Conference leaders and ranks second among Texas State's team leaders with 6.4 tackles per game. Iwuji led the Bobcats in tackles with eight tackles at Nicholls, and seven tackles in each game against Southeastern Louisiana and Southern Utah. Iwuji began the season with a career-high 10 tackles against Angelo State and he had seven tackles versus at TCU before recording four stops against Texas Southern. Iwuji's 10 tackles against Angelo State doubled his previous career high of five set against Texas Southern in 2008.

#### **WIGGINS IN THE INTERCEPTION COLUMN**

Redshirt freshman Mario Wiggins intercepted a pass by Texas Southern's Arvell Nelson in the fourth quarter, returned it 48 yards to

the Tiger's 25-yard line and set up Texas State's final touchdown of the game. He is the third different Bobcat to intercept a pass this season.

#### MILLER INTERCEPTS FIRST PASS

Junior safety T.P. Miller also intercepted the first pass of his career in the second quarter at TCU. The interception came at Texas State's 32 yard line to help lead to the first touchdown for the Bobcats in the game.

#### THOMPSON INTERCEPTS FIRST PASS

Senior cornerback Will Thompson recorded the first interception of his career against Angelo State. It was one of two turnovers he collected for the Bobcats. He also recovered a fumble and broke up two other passes to go along with his one solo tackle.

#### UP NEXT

After the Central Arkansas game, Texas State closes out the regular season with two home games against McNeese State on Nov. 14 and Sam Houston State on Nov. 21.
